**Prerequisites:** *GERM302 or equivalent*

**Language of instruction:** German

**Course Goals:** Development of fluency in spoken German. Discussion of contemporary issues related to Germany in the context of Europe. Thus, the goal of the course is to significantly improve students' German conversational skills by reading and discussing current events in politics, culture, sports and entertainment as presented through a variety of virtual or hard copy texts as well as videos and music.

3. In addition to the daily readings, the course requires periodic grammar reviews. **german in review** by Kimberly Sparks/Van Horn Vail (ISBN 0-8384-6066-6) is the preferred review grammar text but students may rely on grammar books they already own.

## Daily Preparation:

1. For each class session one reading will be selected either by the instructor or students. Students are responsible for
  - a. reading the assignment
  - b. memorizing new vocabulary on worksheet
  - e. completing worksheets
  - f. writing a short summary of article (about 5 sentences)
  - g. preparing two questions for discussion.
- 2) Grammar assignments will be made according to need
- 3) Systematic memorization of strong verbs (to be assigned daily)

## Grading:

**40% Attendance, participation and homework** - Attendance is mandatory for the successful completion of this course. Written homework assignments will be graded and must be handed in before class and placed on the instructor's desk. **No late assignments** will be accepted. Students will be asked to lead discussions on assigned readings and prepare a special topic for presentation and discussion.

**30% Quizzes** covering vocabulary, dictation, grammar, readings, strong verbs will be un/announced. **No make-up quizzes.**

**30% Final** – The final consists of two parts, a 15 minute Oral Interview (15%) to be scheduled individually during exam week and a Written Exam (15%), **Wednesday, December 17, 8:00am-10:00am**
